Died Oct 25, 1944 in Lexington, Massachusetts

D. Ann Jane (Irwin) Dickson and William Wilson – Married (Unknown)

Ann Born Dec 25. 1835 in Lisderry, Ireland
Died Oct 3, 1899 in Arlington, Massachusetts

William Born Jun 17, 1831 in Fermagh , Ireland (One of Identical triplets)
Died Nov 27, 1891
