## Dear Sister Clara & Neice Carrie

I suppose that George and Josiah had a nice time together Josiah is very pleasant company and so is Nellie. It is to bad he does not live this way it costs so much to come from San Francisco last. Maria + family have moved to Winchester to live. Gertrude is againg to be married and keep house and they took the notion of mooving out of town and have let thier house but I hope they wont live away long I will miss them very much. I think that they also be homesick to come back in time. Sam is about the same as he has been. It is hard for Sam to be sick and hard for those who take care of him night and day Josiah wrote me while at your home that he and Nellie was having a fine time. I enjoyed his visit but was sorry I was not able to go round with Josiah and wife I had [cotted] on his coming on. Josiah wrote (Carrie') that you had been sick I was very sorry but hope that you are all well now I think that have had more than your share of sickness. Effie + Emma + husband and baby are well. When Emma has any pictures taken of the baby she will send you + Edith one She only had a few taken of the baby. The baby is very cunning so we think Pauline can talk quite well. [Leorinyo] has been haveing quite a sick spell this summer a fever with nueralgia but I think he is gaining and getting better he had aught to have a good rest but he will go to his work men are poor hands to be sick. When do you go to your new house Carrie you [surot] me a good description of the house and place. I think I should allmost know the house if I see it. It must be very handsome and a nice house. Josiah wrote to Russell about it and was quite pleased with the place. What a trip Josiah did take (on gaining home) to Yellowstone Park. Josiah is bound to have a good time. It was quite wonderful the sights he saw there I suppose Josiah wrote you all about them. Is he not a good fellow Russell is better than he was when Josiah was here he has had a [sloot] fever one day he would feel better and the next day not so well but he is gaining now we all wish to be remembered to George and all of the rest of the family write when you can I shall be glad to hear from you
